

Paediatric Referral Guidance

The following are felt by the paediatric department at Bucks Hospitals Trust to be suitable for management in primary care in most cases:

Nervous system	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Migraine unless atypical or no response to treatment • Behavioral difficulties • Sleep problems
Respiratory	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wheezers • asthma unless difficult to control • Breath holding
Gastro	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gastro-oesophageal reflux not on optimum treatment • Constipation • Encopresis • Recurrent abdominal pain • Worms
Renal	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Enuresis • UTI unless indicated by NICE guidelines
General	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Tired/ possible chronic fatigue unless GP has done screening tests (see NICE guidelines) • lethargy • frequent infections without screening tests • Head lice • Faints/Vasovagal episodes • Plagiocephaly • Sacral pits
Dermatology/Allergy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Rashes • Eczema/food allergy
Endocrine	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Overweight/Obesity unless associated comorbidities
Haematology	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Low Hb • nutritional anaemia • Iron deficiency anaemia without baseline screen
Neonatal	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Plagiocephaly
